- The paper should follow 12-point Times New Roman Font. Headings can be in bold and numbered in Arabic.
- Subheadings should follow roman numbers.
- Margin 1 inch all four sides, line spacing 1.5.
- Follow APA style guide for in-text citations and references.
 - All submissions should be original unpublished work of author(s) and should be submitted in .doc/.docx format.
- Plagiarism should be less than 10 per cent and use of AI is strictly prohibited
