Annual Day Address by the Principal

मानव जाति के इतिहास की भीषण त्रासदी कोरोना के प्रकोप से निकलकर दुनिया पुनः जीवन की ओर लौट रही है। कोरोना ने हम सभी को चेता दिया कि दुनिया की जीवन जीने की आधुनिक भोगवादी शैली पूरी तरह से असफल सिद्ध हो चुकी है। हमारे सामने से होकर गुजरा मौत का बवंडर अट्टहास करते हुए बता गया कि जो मानव सभ्यता वस्तुवादी जीवन को अपनाकर आधुनिक होने का दंभ भर रही थी वह अपनी तमाम वैज्ञानिक खोजों के बावजूद एक सूक्ष्म से जीवाणु के आगे घुटने टेक गई। हमारे अस्पताल बेबस और विज्ञान लाचार हो गया। लेकिन भारत ने निराशा से उबरने का ज्योति मार्ग दिखाकर तथा इस भीषण समय में सबकी मदद के लिए अपना हाथ बढ़ाकर अपनी 'वसुधिव कुटुंबकम्' की मानवतावादी सोच से दुनिया को अपना मुरीद बना लिया है।

आज मैं अरविंद महाविद्यालय सांध्य का वार्षिक प्रतिवेदन प्रस्तुत करते हुए देश की उसी मानवतावादी भावना से ओतप्रोत 'सर्वे संतु निरामयाः' वाले सिद्धांत को केंद्रीय विचार बनते हुए देख रही हूं। भारत का जीवन दर्शन हमें समझा रहा है कि शिक्षा संस्थानों का उद्देश्य गगनचुंबी इमारतों के लिए मशीनी मानव पैदा करना नहीं है, अस्पतालों के लिए संवेदनहीन उपचार करने वाले डॉक्टर बनाना नहीं है, विध्वंसक हथियारों को बनाने वाले वैज्ञानिक पैदा करना नहीं है, दुनिया को आकर्षक बनाने के लिए उसके पर्यावरण का विनाश करने वाले वास्तुकारों को गढ़ना नहीं है।

आलोचक कुछ भी कहते रहे सच यह है कि भारत कभी भी पलायनवादी संकुचित सोच का पोषक नहीं रहा। वह सदा से ही जीव, जगत, माया और ब्रह्म के साथ ब्रह्मोस के समस्त भाव के साथ जीवन को उत्सव मानकर जीने का पक्षधर रहा है। ऊर्ध्वगामी दृष्टिकोण अपनाते हुए उसने ज्ञान के साथ विज्ञान, राग के साथ वैराग, गृहस्थ के साथ वानप्रस्थ और शिक्षा के साथ दीक्षा का संतुलन बना कर मानव जीवन को प्रकृति से भिन्न अथवा विच्छिन्न नहीं होने दिया। आज शिक्षा सा विद्या या विमुक्तये, विद्या ददाति विनयम्, तमसो मा ज्योतिर्गमय, विद्या शास्त्रद्वज शस्त्रमञ्ज, ऐसे मूल मंत्रों को लेकर चल रही है।

वर्तमान सरकार के नीति निर्धारकों ने नई राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति 2020 को तैयार किया है। इस नई राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति का उद्देश्य भारत के अनुभूति परक ज्ञान को दुनिया तक पहुंचाना है , जिसके प्रमुख बिंदु हैं

- 1 प्रत्येक बच्चे की क्षमता को पहचान कर उस क्षमता का विकास करना
- 2 साक्षरता एवं संख्यात्मकता के ज्ञान को बच्चों के अंदर अंदर सहज रूप से विकसित करना
- 3 शिक्षा को लचीला, बहु विषयक, पारदर्शी और उद्देश्य मूलक बनाना
- 4 बच्चों को भारतीय संस्कृति से जोड़ना
- 5 उत्कृष्ट शोध शोध की प्रवृत्ति को बढ़ावा देना
- 6 अनुशासन और नैतिकता सिखाना
- 7 तकनीकी के यथासंभव उपयोग पर जोर देना
- 8 मातृभाषा को केंद्र में रखकर विभिन्न भाषाओं को सिखाना 9 बच्चों की सोच को मौलिक, रचनात्मक एवं तार्किक बनाना

आज दुनिया के मानचित्र पर भारत का ज्ञानात्मक अनुभूति दर्शन प्रकट हो रहा है। शिक्षा और मित्र की पहचान जीवन के सामान्य और दुष्कर दोनों समय में होती है [हमारी शिक्षा मात्र सुख सुविधाओं और वस्तुओं के संग्रह करने वाली नीति पर आधारित नहीं है । वह मध्यमार्गी है जिसमें पदार्थ और सिद्धार्थ दोनों का सामंजस्य दिखाई पड़ता है । शिक्षा स्वार्थ के लिए नहीं अपितु परमार्थ के लिए है। अपने साथ- साथ पर्यावरण, वनस्पति, जीव जंतुओं, चर अचर सब के कल्याण हेतु है।

भारत की मानवतावादी सोच विस्तार वादी अथवा अधिनायक वादी सोच वाले देशों के सामने कोविड के समय, चीनी आक्रमण के समय और फिलहाल रूस यूक्रेन युद्ध के समय स्व रक्षा, पर उपकार और कूटनीति की एक से बढ़कर एक मिसाल पेश कर चुकी है। हमारा ग्रह पृथ्वी तभी खुशहाल और समृद्ध रह सकता है जब हम सभी के कल्याण को अपना ध्येय बनाएं। भारत की सनातन संस्कृति क्रूर से क्रूर परिस्थितियों में भी सफल और सुफल सिद्ध हुई है। वह जियो और जीने दो के सिद्धांत पर चलती है वह एक हाथ में ज्ञान प्रसार हेतु शास्त्र रखती

है, तो दूसरे हाथ में आत्मरक्षा हेतु शस्त्र। इसी नीति का परिणाम है कि देश का जो तिरंगा केवल बलिदानियों के ऊपर चढ़ता था, अब उसे देखकर युद्धक देश अपना युद्ध रोक देते हैं। भारत ने अपने देश के नागरिकों को तो यूक्रेन से मौत के मुंह से निकला ही है, बल्कि अन्य देशों के नागरिकों को भी अपना समझकर बचाया है। नई राष्ट्रीय शिक्षा नीति के पीछे भी उसी सनातन संस्कृति का प्रभाव परिलक्षित होता है। आत्मनिर्भरता, रचनात्मकता, शोध दृष्टि का विकास, विज्ञान और अध्यात्म की समरसता, और इसके साथ ही अभिव्यक्ति के लिए मात्रभाषा – नई शिक्षा नीति के इन सूत्र सिद्धांतों का प्रभाव और परिणाम सामने भी आने लगा है। आज का युवा नौकरी लेने वाला नहीं अपितु नौकरियां देने वाला बन रहा है। इसका उदाहरण है साल 202 की घरेलू स्टार्टअप की रिपोर्ट जिसके अनुसार साल 202 में इंडियन स्टार्टअप्स का प्रदर्शन काफी शानदार रहा।

साल के दौरान अपने निवेशकों का भरोसा जीता और एक साल में 2020 की तुलना में फंडिंग 3 गुना से ज्यादा बढ़ा ली। वही ऊंचे वैल्यूएशन वाले क्लब में भारतीय स्टार्टअप की संख्या साल में दोगुना से ज्यादा बढ़ गई। यूनिकॉर्न के मामले में अर्थात एक अरब डॉलर से अधिक मूल्यांकन वाले स्टार्टअप्स के मामले में भारत दुनिया का तीसरा सबसे बड़ा देश बन चुका है। रिपोर्ट के अनुसार युवाओं में अपने कारोबार को लेकर बढ़ते रुझान और सरकार के द्वारा नए कारोबारियों को प्रोत्साहित करने की वजह से देश का स्टार्टअप सेमेंट मजबूती पकड़ रहा है।

रिपोर्ट के अनुसार भारत 90 यूनिकॉर्न की संख्या के साथ अमेरिका और चीन के बाद तीसरा बड़ा यूनिकॉर्न मौजूदगी वाला देश बन गया है। वहीं भारत करीब 60000 #०४॥५/०5 की संख्या के साथ तीसरा बड़ा स्टार्टअप परिवेश वाला देश बन गया है। रिपोर्ट कहती है कि ये 88५० न केवल नवोन्मेषी समाधान एवं तकनीक लेकर आ रहे हैं बल्कि बड़े पैमाने पर रोजगार भी पैदा कर रहे हैं।

कहने को बहुत कुछ है संक्षेप में मैं आज महा विद्यालय के वार्षिक दिवस 2022 पर आप सभी छात्र छात्राओं से यही कहना चाहती हूं कि हमारे देश में अब सामाजिक आर्थिक और राष्ट्रीय दृष्टि से एक नए युग का प्रारंभ हो चुका है। 21वीं सदी के इस नवजागरण में सामाजिक दृष्टि से जातियों की मुंडेर टूट रही है, आर्थिक दृष्टि से हमारा युवा परंपरागत खेती और रचनात्मक

कार्यो की ओर बढ़ रहा है तथा राष्ट्रवादी भाव नई पीढ़ी की सोच में अंकुरित हो रहे हैं । मैं आशान्वित हूँ कि नवचेतना के इस युग में, सर्वे भवतु सुखिनः, सर्वे संतु निरामयाः, सर्वे भद्राणि पश्यंतु, मां कश्चित् दुःख भाग भवेत् ।

इसी के साथ मैं अपनी वाणी को विराम देती हूँ ।

About the College

History:

Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) established in 1984 is a constituent College of the University of Delhi. The College has completed 38 years that charter all the phases of its growth and success. Each year can be seen as a milestone in the history of this young institution. Since 1988 the college opened its doors to women students too.

The College began by offering instructions in B.A. (Prog.) and B.Com. (Prog.) Courses. Over the years courses in B.Com. (Honours), B.A. (Honours) Hindi and B.A. (Honours) Applied Psychology were introduced. In the Academic Session 2013-14 the new Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUP) was introduced and under FYUP new Honours Courses in English & Economics were introduced in the College.

The Three Year Undergraduate Program was reintroduced in the academic session 2014-15 and the FYUP was discontinued. From the year 2015-2016 the choice based programme (CBCS) has been introduced. The College presently offers the following courses in 1st. year: B.Com. (Hons.), B.Com., B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology, B.A. (Hons.) Hindi, B.A. (Prog.), B.A (hons.) English and B.A (Hons) Economics.

A special cell for **Career Guidance** has been functioning in the college. It has been successfully helping the students, by providing them valuable information, about career opportunities available to them. Apart from academic excellence, the College lays extra emphasis on the development of integrated and all-round development of the students. Discipline and sincerity are the hall marks of this institution. Our alumni holding their positions in life - with responsibility, zeal, courage and conviction - vindicate our faith in the goals before us.

Knowledge Centre: Library

The College library of the Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) is committed to excellence in innovative information service. It aspires to support the faculty members and the students in their need to seek information.

The College library is well-equipped and boasts of a collection consisting of more than 45,500 volumes of books, in nearly all relevant subjects and all ICT facilities. The library has a rich collection of the Reference Section consisting of Reference books, Encyclopedias, Classic collection of Literature, Dictionaries, and CDs etc. on different subjects. The library also subscribes to a number of magazines, newspapers, printed Journals and E- Journals and E-books (N-LIST E-Resources). The library is using Cloud based software, namely *E-Granthalaya 4.0* software, which is developed by NIC and provides computerized library services to the Academic community.

Key Features of Library:

- It provides facility of various relevant printed and e-resources to the faculty members, non-teaching staff and the students.
- It provides a remote Access facility of N-LIST E-Resources to the Faculty members and students.
- It provides 08 computer systems in the library, to access the Internet and various E-Resources.
- It provides facility of two computers with Non Visual Desktop Access (a Screen Reading Accessibility Software for the People with Visual Impairment).
- It provides computerized library services to the users with the help of integrated library software.
- It provides Mobile Apps based Web OPAC facility for the Library Users.

Activities conducted by the Library:

- **Remote Access to N-LIST E-Resources:** The College library is also a member of N-LIST (INFILIBNET) E-Resources. The library created member ID login for the

students and faculty members, and provided a remote login access facility of N-LIST e-resources.

- **DU “eLibrary”:** The College library provides access to full-text learning e-Resources for faculty Members Through DULS.
- **Open E-resources Links:** The College library has provided and uploaded E-books /E-Resources links on the college website to access E-Resources.
- **Installation and Implementation E-Granthalaya 4.0 software:** During this year library has installed and successfully implemented new Cloud based software, namely E-Granthalaya 4.0 software and almost completed the computerization process of Library Services.

Departmental Reports

Department of Applied Psychology

During the academic session 2021-22 following activities were carried out:

1. **Psycho-Bye-Namics-Online Farewell Party:**

On July 19, 2021, a memorable virtual farewell was organized for the batch of students who had passed out in year 2021. This event was held virtually on Google Meet platform. The entire event was managed by juniors. The Event commenced by welcome speech followed by melodious *Saraswati Vandana*, hailing the Goddess of knowledge and wisdom. The Principal and the teachers of the department conveyed their best wishes to the outgoing batch. Various interesting activities and games were part of the event. Any farewell is incomplete without singing, so students gave singing performances. The event concluded with the thanks giving by junior students.

2. **An International workshop on “Challenges and opportunities of organization in Indian context”:**

On August 23, 2021, an International workshop on “*Challenges and Opportunities of Organization Behavior in Indian Context*” was organized. Dr. Sanjay Kumar Singh, Professor, Maynooth University School of Business, Ireland was the speaker. The key boundaries of the presentation included context in which organization works, resource dependence, effective leadership, competition. He also discussed about pandemic situation affecting work pattern of organization, digitalization etc. The workshop covered all relevant topics in parallel with recent researches and in accordance with challenges and opportunities in post pandemic period like New Normal, Change Management etc.

3. **Interactive session on “Healthy lifestyle for the younger generation”:**

On September 7, 2021, an interactive session was organized by Department of Applied Psychology. The speaker for the session was Mr. Anil Mudgal, Yogacharya. It was conducted via a virtual platform on the topic of ‘*Healthy Lifestyle for the Young Generation*’. He talked about how life could be simpler in these complex and chaotic life processes that today’s young generation indulges in, with the extreme burst of

digitalization, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, with just the help of two major components: Yoga and Ayurveda.

4. “Promoting Civic Engagement in Youth”-An Interactive session:

The session was conducted by Mr. Anil Rohilla, Senior Auditor, Controller General of Defense Accounts on September 11, 2021. He is also known as tree man of India. He talked about the importance of youth engagement and how it leads to increased academic performance and improved social-emotional well-being. It was very insightful session for students.

5. A workshop on “Clinical case study and Interview taking skills”:

An online workshop on Clinical Case study and Interview taking Skills in Indian Context was conducted on September 19, 2021. The speaker of the workshop was Dr. Lalit Kumar Singh, an Assistant Professor at the department of Psychiatry, PGIMS, Chandigarh. Dr. Lalit talked about clinical psychology in brief that it is an integration of science, theory, and clinical knowledge for the purpose of understanding, preventing, and relieving psychologically-based distress or dysfunction and to promote subjective well-being and personal development of individuals. The Speaker taught about case study in depth with a help of a simple yet self-explanatory presentation faced by psychologists specifically in India. All these takeaways from the workshop clearly helped and aided.

6. Workshop on “Psychologist as expert witness in criminal cases”:

On the occasion of Mental Health Week (October 10-15, 2021), a workshop was conducted by Dr. Subir Kumar on October 13, 2021. Dr. Kumar is An Associate Professor, National University of Study and Research in Law, Ranchi. He talked about the role of psychologist as an expert witness and how forensic psychology expert witnesses conduct forensic evaluations and write expert reports regarding criminal profiles. It was very informative session.

7. Virtual fresher’s Party:

The Psychological society of the Department of Applied Psychology welcomed the 1st semester students through a virtual fresher’s party on February 4, 2022 on ZOOM platform. Program started with the welcome speech followed by the Principal’s address. On this occasion, different games were organized for the new batch of students. 7. Comm fiesta 2021

The Commerce Society of Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) organized a fest for two days in a virtual mode beginning from 16 October 2021 to 17 October 2021. Comm fiesta was a tremendous success, with 1,754 students participating in five events spread over 2 days.

- **Event 1 - Samadhan: The Case Study Competition** Discussed earlier
- **Event 2 - KBCUIZ- The ultimate KBC experience in a brand new avatar** Kbcuiz was a multi-level quiz competition organized for quiz enthusiasts from October 16, at 2.00 PM to October 17, 2021 until 4pm. The game consisted of 3 rounds beginning with the elimination round called "fastest fingers" fast, followed by the bonus round for the selected participants namely the bonus box and finally the conclusion round, the ultimate KBC quiz with a total of 339 registrations in the game. the top 3 were declared as the winners from different colleges and universities of India.
- **Event 3 - Among us, The murder mystery.** This competition began on October 16 at 1.00 pm and lasted till 12.00 pm on October 17, 2021. The event was planned over Three rounds wherein the first two were elimination rounds and the finale was the survival round. Winners are from various prestigious institutions of India.

The Cricket Quiz started on October 16 at 5.00 pm and final result was declared at 3.00 pm on October 17, 2021. The game consisted of two rounds being the first as the elimination quiz round which witnessed participation from more than 250 students from various colleges from all over India via Dare2compete(D2C). Wetlands support high concentrations of birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, fish and invertebrate species.

“*Wetlands Action for People and Nature*” is the theme of World Wetlands Day 2022 which is emphasizing the importance of actions to ensure the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands. Wetland habitats are disappearing due to a lack of understanding of their important functions, values, goods and services.

Department of Environmental Studies celebrated *World Wetlands Day* on February 2, 2022 to raise awareness among students about wetlands and its conservation. Department organised online poster making competition the theme “*Wetlands Action for People and Nature*” on the occasion of World Wetlands Day on February 2, 2022. 1. On October 16, 2021, *Itihas Darpan* of the Department of History organized a talk on “*Situating Women in Freedom Movement: How important was their role in shaping the struggle*” delivered by Prof Vijayalaxmi Singh from University of Delhi. This talk was a part of the yearlong activities to be organized by the college to commemorate the celebration of “*Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav*” It was a well-attended and highly interactive talk. Prof Singh elaborated on the methodological and conceptual framework for undertaking a historical study of *gender* within the interstices of colonial period including freedom movement and post-independent India. Her empirically rich talk mentioned of several women freedom fighters including *Vijay laxmi Pandit, Sarojini Naidu, Raj Kumari Amrit Kaur, Bhikaji Cama*, who became part of mainstream politics and took the freedom movement to new sections of society by creating a space for women in it. She also talked of lesser known revolutionaries like *Kanaklata Baruah, Matangini Hazra, Bhogeswari Phuknani, Suniti*

Chaudhury, Pritilata Wadedkar etc whose deep patriotism could not prevent them from crossing the threshold of acceptable feminine virtues to prove their love for their country.

In her study on post-independence period, Prof Singh enunciated of how the relegation of women back to the domestic domain, hindered the pace of women empowerment immediately after independence. Nevertheless, the contribution of women freedom fighters never put to rest the issues that limit the public appearance of women. It also significantly covered the distance that needed to be traversed to encourage gender equity.

The talk stimulated the curiosity of the audience and was followed by several questions which the speaker answered with enough candor and wits.

2. In addition to the above talk, the Department also successfully conducted *Fresher's Welcome* followed by a Speech making competition on February 7, 2022. The topic of the Speech making competition was "*Historical Spaces: An Insight*". Professor Kusumlata (Principal) joined the programme and addressed the large online gathering of guests. Dr. Seema Mathur and Dr. Angad Kumar Tiwari were the jury members for the competition. The other dignified faculty members of the college graced the occasion, and the presentation of the students were highly appreciated by all.


Lecture Demonstration-II





- Under the aegis of IQAC , the Department of Sanskrit, Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) University of Delhi organized a virtual program on “**Srimad BhagavadGita Ka Parichay aur Anuvad**” dated August 24, 2021 . Speaker of the program was Prof. Kusum Lata (Principal, SACE). She said that the deeper you go into *Gita*, the richer are the meanings that you derive. It is not a collection of do's and don'ts. It prohibits the desire for fruit. It is beyond the mere *intellect* because it is essentially addressed to the *heart*. . It is not for those who have no faith, because it can be understood only by pure - hearted persons. - **Sanskrit Martand Samman Samaroh** : Under the aegis of IQAC, department of Sanskrit and a team of SACE felicitated Prof. **Satya Vrat Shastri** . He was conferred “**Sanskrit**

Martand Samman” at his residence on August 25, 2021. Dr. Raman Kumar read citation in the honour of Prof. Satya Vrat Shastri .Prof. Satya Vrat Shastri(29 September 1930 – 14 November 2021) was an Indian Sanskrit scholar, writer, grammarian and poet. He wrote three Mahakavyas, three *Khandakavyas*, one *Prabandhakavyas* and one *Patrakavya* and five works in critical writing in Sanskrit. His important works are *Ramakirtimahakavyam*, *BrahattaramBharatam*, *Sribodhisattvacharitam* etc. He was an honorary professor at the Special Centre for Sanskrit Studies (now known as the School of Sanskrit and Indic Studies (SSIS), Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He was the Head of the Department of Sanskrit and the Dean of the Faculty of Arts at the University of Delhi. More than 150 people joined this virtual event .

- Under the aegis of IQAC , the Department of Sanskrit,Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) University of Delhi organized a virtual program on “***Gita Ke Mukhya Slokon Ka Parayan Evan Geeta Aarti Ka Vachan***” dated December 24, 2021 . This program was organized on the occasion of Gita Jayanti, to felicitate Bhagvad Gita, the sacred text of the Hindus. 



Commercia: 7th Volume



ENACTUS

The Enactus chapter of Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) was formed in 2016 and is one of the most active student organizations on the south campus, University of Delhi. The chapter works on the principles of social entrepreneurship in running two projects PROJECT ISHTA and PROJECT ANNAPOORNA, which has been our flagship project since inception. The projects help to give real life experience and exposure of all facets of social entrepreneurship and management to its members, including increasing financial and entrepreneurial literacy. PROJECT ISHTA - 'Initiative for Sanitation and Hygiene Towards All' – a project on woman entrepreneurship for hygienic sanitation. Project ISHTA is aimed at enabling complete, inexpensive public hygiene for women. We have created a convenient, hygienic and waterproof toilet seat cover which fits all seats and gives complete coverage and protection. The project complements the government's vision of "SWACHH BHARAT" as the proceeds from our toilet seat covers are used for the construction of public toilets in underserved regions. Clean is also green. ISHTA is minimalistic and follows 3 R's- 'Reduce' the use of paper, 'Redeploy' proceeds for sanitation, and use 'Recyclable' material for safe disposal.

The basic aim of PROJECT ANNAPOORNA is Women Empowerment through Social Entrepreneurship, and it has enabled 3 women, who were earlier homemakers, to establish a tiffin service business. The student team act as management consultants and have provided the necessary ecosystem for enabling a domestic activity to take the form of a flourishing business. The Society has honed the business skills of these homemakers and has thus not only helped to make them self-reliant and financially empowered, but is also instrumental in improving the financial condition of their families.

Project X - Culture

Project X-Culture project is a large-scale experiential learning collaborative exercise initiated by the University of North Carolina USA. Students from Sri Aurobindo College (Evening) have been selected for the project under the mentorship of Dr Sumati Varma since 2013.

Dr Sumati Varma was given the Global Educator Award for her contribution to the project in the current year. She has been a member of the Executive Board of Project X – Culture since 2014.

The last year saw 22 students from the college participate in the project alongside a total of 5000 students from 125 universities in 40 countries on six continents. They worked in 902 global virtual teams, each comprised of about 6 team members, each coming from a different country.

The Project is designed to provide students with an opportunity to gain first-hand experience in international virtual collaboration. Working in global virtual teams, the students developed a business proposal for one of half a dozen international companies as partners and provided a detailed plan for implementing the idea.

This year's corporate partners included companies such as Plastic Revolutions, an American manufacturer of recycling equipment and operator of one of the country's largest recycling plants; Sacona, an Indian manufacturer of 5D gaming machines and flight simulators; Unplag, a Ukrainian plagiarism detection software company; Odyseed, a Belgian manufacturer of indoor mini greenhouses, to name a few.

During the project, the students had numerous live webinars with their client company owners or CEOs, where the students had an opportunity to learn more about the business, its history and products, ask questions, and receive feedback on their suggestions. Depending on the geography, many students also had an opportunity to visit their client company, have a company tour, meet the management team, and present their work.

Furthermore, the X-Culture Project is a platform for high-quality research on dynamics and performance in global virtual teams. The longitudinal multi-level data collected as a part of the project are used to study dynamics and performance in global in international workgroups.

We are publishing our blogs at WordPress blogging website, which is the world's largest platform for blogging posts. We post a fresh blog every Monday. Blogs are based on stereotypes related to gender, sexuality, LGBTQ+ community, and mental health that exist within the society.

The stereotypes demolisher trailblazer blog series has set its foot into this new chapter of social media in the land of TELEGRAM and REDDIT! Our initiative of "PANKH - AZAD UDAAN" is expanded and we are accepting blogs from outside too. We are proud to say that we have issued 48 blogs till now. Too many untold tales, stories of courage, eye-opening stories, and breaking stereotypes!

LIVE SESSIONS (LGBTQIA+ Awareness)

- On the 8th of August we had an Up Close and Personal with Meenu Padha who is a lawyer, President (J&K) of the National Child and Women Development Council, and Vice President of the Women Empowerment and Child Rights Movement, a live session

where we discussed breaking stereotypes, questions related to women's inequality, lessons for child abuse survivors and we had a fruitful conversation.

- We had another Up Close and Personal, live session on August 22nd with Rahul Malde and Sushank Chibber where they shared their beautiful story which reminded us of the fact that love has no boundary, gender, or religion.
- On 12th September we did another Up Close and Personal, live session with Himani Bajaj and Harshita Chhatlani where we talked about breaking stereotypes, feminist advocacy, queer and gender minorities rights, and many more. Himani Bajaj (they/them) identify as a non-binary/gender fluid lesbian and aspire to be a queer activist. Harshita Chhatlani (She/her) is a journalist passionate about the rights of gender minorities. She works for feminist advocacy, queer and gender Minorities rights, and sexual and reproductive health and rights.
- Another Up Close and Personal, live session was held with Suryatapa Mukherjee on 26th September. Suryatapa is a reporter, currently with Suno India. She has written for Vice, HuffPost, Asia Times, The Wire, and worked for The Quint and Mojo story. She chaired the Media Representation panel on Bi Pride UK 2020. She is trans genderfluid, pansexual, and has ADHD. To hear all the stories she shared we had more than 300 people join together on live.

SAMAGAM - The Gender Inclusive Fair

Gender Championship Cell, SACE has collaborated with 7 societies to put forward creativity in bulk! We felt proud to announce the first-ever GENDER INCLUSIVE FAIR. Art, Drama, Music, Fashion novas and so much more with the aim to promote Gender inclusivity. We were super happy to announce that the week-long fair will consist of six days of exciting competition with 6 different societies to not just theorize competition and confine it to those who compete but to convey the message of all the societies. People had a chance to win amazing prizes and have a lot of fun at the same time. The event ended with a culmination day.

- GC X IMAGINIQUE: The Gender championship cell of SACE collaborated with Imaginique, the creative arts society of SACE for creative arts competition. We received a total of 64 registrations where 10 participants were selected for the final round which took place on the 9th of November and participants worked on the concept of story depiction through their artwork on the theme of gender inclusivity.
- GC X RANGMANCH: The gender Championship cell in collaboration with Rangmanch: The Dramatics Society presented Noor which was a drama competition. Where we received 26 entries, out of which 10 were selected for the finals where Mr. Sufiyan Khan the founder of the Rangmanch society judged the performances. The event was fun and a great success where we got to see so many amazing acting skills.
- GC X VICHAR VIMARSH: The competition had two rounds, round one culminating on 8 September. In round one, the participants had to send a maximum 2 minutes video of themselves, speaking on the topic: "should menstruation be talked about only for women?". The common debate was held on 11 November at 4 pm. The topic for the

debate was: "should public spaces be gender-neutral?" Round two was judged by a panel of 3 judges, Shivam Shandilya, Preeti, and Rajesh Jha. The event concluded with the judges giving their feedback to participants and the convenors giving some concluding thoughts. The total registration for the event was 77

- GC X WDC: Gender Championship Cell collaborated with the Women Development Cell to organize a Spoken Competition called "SWAR". The theme of this event was "Gender Inclusivity". The event was divided into 2 rounds. In Round 1, participants shared their video in which they portrayed their thoughts on "Gender Inclusivity" through poems, stories, speeches and more. We got 73 Registrations in total. And the other was Bonus Round, Quizzaria - A small quiz with exciting Crossword Puzzles. In this particular Round, We got 4 Participants who were given Bonus points. The last round was on the virtual app, Zoom, where each participant had to give their judgment on what inspired them to click the picture and what they think of it. Finally, The Judgment was done by the Collaborating societies itself.
- GC X DYNAMICS: The Gender Championship Cell in collaboration with Dynamics: The Fashion Society presented Queerista: the fashion competition, the 6th competition of SAMAGAM: The Gender Inclusive Fair, took place on 14th November, which was judged by none other than Hiten Noonwal, via a Zoom Meet held from 3pm to 4:30pm. We welcomed 10 of our most amazing contenders, with the challenge of Recreating looks of famous Queer Artists, in our final round: Re-Queer. What got them there was our first round: Limitless, whose ultimate deadline was 12th November, 5pm, with the challenge of breaking gender stereotypes. Where in, we received up to 37 registrations in total.

On the culmination day, SAMAGAM went without a hitch and was extremely queer-friendly. We organized the most delightful and engaging webinar ever. The event was commenced officially by our principal ma'am, Dr. Kusum Lata who addressed everyone and highlighted how queer awareness is increasing and people are getting aware and doing things for the queer welfare. Further, our convenor Dr. Monika Rikhi addressed the audience on how the team has given their best to make this event a great success. Meraki - The Music Society of the college gave a breathtaking performance. Later, the one and only, Sushant Divgikar AKA Rani Ko-He-Nur joined us. He is a performing Artist/ Singer /Equal Rights Champion & Motivational Speaker. The Artist with the voice of an angel and a presence that oozes sass. His Drag Character "Rani Ko-He-Nur" is bonafide. superstar of the Indian drag scene, promoting inclusivity and love. Further, the winners of the competitions were announced of all the competitions which

were organized with all six collaborating societies. The event was conducted over zoom platform and more than 400 people joined which made the event a grand success.

Gender Audit Awareness Workshop

In an attempt to understand the implication of a gender neutral organization and to work towards creating a gender sensitive atmosphere in it, the GSC organized a talk by Prof Namita Rajput titled Gender Audit Workshop on September 17th 2021

GENDER ANALYSIS, is process of collecting and analyzing the sex disaggregated data and information to understand the gender differences.

Different institutions and organizations have different parameters that they take care of.

In Women organizations, there are two important aspects:

1. Spreading awareness about gender equality in the society.
2. Make Your Girls ready for the 21st century challenges.

In Coed institutions:

1. equal opportunities should not be given to all irrespective of their gender.
2. The organization should be gender neutral.

We have to make efforts, conduct discussions and debates, have live sessions with transgender people to know about their problems. That is when people in the society will begin to become sensitive towards them. Workshops should be held in order to explain the seriousness of the topic and the small issues that come along. There should be mutual respect for everyone, showing peers that we are a gender sensitive organization. Students cannot be exposed to such sensitive scenes or information directly, so we can display serious causes and issues in animated form to make them informed and aware. They should also be taught to respect all genders. An organization that promotes gender neutrality should not tolerate any kind of gender discrimination.

Gender is a social construct that has been prevalent since years. It includes gender roles for men and women and gender norms that everyone is supposed to follow.

Over the years we have seen gender inequality. Gender equity is an instrument which leads to gender equality.

We do gender analysis to design and implement the projects in a way that will close the gender inequality gaps. Females should be involved in all kinds of decision making from the very start.

Gender mainstreaming means to start programs where males and females both are involved.

Within gender audit, we are introducing participatory audit. It refers to the audit of the ratio of number of males and number of females that are participating in a particular project. Gender participation or inclusion should be throughout the project and consistent, not just time.

Unlayering the term Gender

Gender refers to "the socially constructed characteristics of women and men – such as norms, roles and relationships . It varies from society to society and can be changed. The concept of gender is exhibited at five levels: relational, hierarchical, historical, contextual and institutional. On 8th February 2022, a webinar was hosted by the Gender Sensitization Committee, Sri Aurobindo (Evening) College, where the guest of honor and speaker was Mrs. Mamta Saha. It was addressed to an audience of 114 people (including the students of the Committee and

different departments of the College) via a virtual platform on the topic of ‘Unlayering the term "Gender"’. The audience was warmly addressed initially by Prof. Kusum Lata, the Principal of Sri Aurobindo (Evening) College.

In this webinar we learned how society could be simpler if these complex and deeply engrained gender stereotypes and social constructs didn't exist. It could be removed with the help of three major components: Acceptance, Sensitization and Change. Initially, we were brought to introspect and derive an overview of the basic definitions and differences between Gender and Sex, misconceptions (good and bad) existing around them, and how our thought processes had changed with time. The seminar enlightened on the aspect of: Gender Discrimination and how it has impacted the growth of Women in the Society. We learned a lot about stereotypes and how they can actually impact the way people view themselves. Also on how stereotypes are psychologically undermining in the impact they cast on people. There are in fact a great and growing number of studies showing the psychological and societal disadvantages of such biases. As we further went into the presentation, we learned about various laws and legislative acts that have contributed in bringing about a change in the society's view of gender roles.. We learned how behavioral change, sensitization, better understanding and empathy towards everyone can not only help in making the world a better place but also, be of huge benefit to the way our future generations will function. Because there's nothing wrong in trying to discover oneself, being oneself and expressing oneself without any fear.

Overall, the session was very informative and enlightening.

It goes without saying that befitting to their their name the *gender champions* kept the flag of working towards creation of gender neutral society flying high.
