

PRIDE MONTH CELEBRATION (June 2020)

LGBTQI+ pride is the promotion of the self-affirmation, dignity, equality, and increased visibility of lesbian, gay, bisexual, non-binary and transgender people as a social group of society. The month of June has been chosen as LGBTQI+ Pride Month, a time when several events are held around the world to raise awareness about people of the community.

All across the world, the LGBTQI+ community and allies work to provide visibility to this marginalized group and create awareness about providing a safe space for all human beings, regardless of gender!

'Love is love' is usually the theme of the events. Gender Championship Cell celebrated Pride Month with students across University of Delhi, in a virtual mode this time. We conducted many activities like one-word challenge, picture challenge, live sessions, etc. which were held over the entire month of June. Many individuals from the LGBTQI+ community & also allies joined us through live sessions on our official Instagram handle to convey the message of dignity, authenticity and equality.

- On 5th June 2020, we were joined by Mr. Garvit Nagpal, in virtual mode with more than 200 individuals as participants.
- On 12th June 2020, we were in conversation with Shabnam Bewafa a.k.a Nitish Anand, one of India's Youngest Drag Queens, which was attended by more than 250 individuals.
- On 19th June 2020, Mr. Mohit, a social media influencer, gave a talk... attended by more than 400 individuals.
- On 26th June 2020, we were joined by Miss Harshita Nair who is a representative of the queer community, social influencer and a personal blogger, with 300 people in attendance.

The team spread the message of dignity, pride and equality among thousands of people in June 2020.

GOONJ – Untold Tales of Courage (Newsletter)

Gender Championship Cell of Sri Aurobindo College(E) proudly presented the first edition of it's Annual Newsletter "GOONJ-UNTOLD TALES OF COURAGE" in July 2020.

Here-in some courageous individuals shared from their life-experience about issues which are swept under the carpet in our society and people just look the other way. The underlying message points to the need to work for the change we want to see in the world. We as a collective, believe that a dialogue should be initiated to shatter the embedded stigmatization wherever it exists.

Further, we believe that oral testimonies have the power to challenge grand narratives of the larger section of the society, which unfortunately tend to privilege heteronormativity and shun those who go against the set binaries of gender. In the Indian context, the 'gender' trouble is not just limited to conformity but acquires a complex character due to the existence of multiple hierarchies like class, caste, creed, etc.

We see this exercise as a way of providing a platform to those voices which were hitherto neglected, crushed and marginalized. We believe that GOONJ will turn every unturned stone of your heart.

With a concern about the systemic increase in attempted-suicide among young adults, we work towards the larger goal of mental-health awareness and accessibility. It's the need of these times to remove the stigma around mental wellness. We work to raise awareness & acknowledgement of mental-health issues and facilitate intervention, where required. On-ground, we make this happen through a strong, research-oriented course of action. Our range of events, campaigns, and workshops all focus on the goal of emotional wellness. Our initiative is highly widespread and is available on many online forums such as Facebook and Instagram. The people associated with Project TALK; do not claim to have legally recognized qualifications or authority to be counsellors or therapists. We act as mentors, guides, and friends to those who choose to contact us.

Our course of initiative through Project TALK:

- Providing professional aid to those who require it by referring/connecting them to a certified professional in our contact.
- Acting as mentors, guides, friends for individuals in need of help.
- Hosting webinars with professionals on Topics related to Mental Health.

- Conducting audience engaging activities to spread and promote awareness.
- Adding informative posts/videos on our official handles to wipe out the stigma attached to Mental Health
- The Gender Championship Cell conducted a successful webinar on 04th October 2020, on the topic- "How to deal with Lock-down Anxiety?", we were joined with our Special guest, Miss. Jasdeep Mago, (Co-founder, Neuropsychologist & Counselor at Invisible Illness India) which was attended by more than 100 individuals. And we received 4 and above rating feedback from 98% participants.

The Gender Championship Cell, SACE conducted a Webinar on 18th of October with Dr.Sanket .R. Mundada, a renowned Neuropsychiatrist, MBBS, DPM (Mumbai) under the Mental Health Advocacy program on the topic, 'Self Care : Good for you and your work'. Dr. Mundada delivered a very informative speech on Mental Health and Self care covering essential topics such as 'Mental health and Mental III-health '.He discussed the importance of Mental health and self-care especially amongst adults as considering the age group which suffers the most with mental health issues is the youth. He gave tips on how to balance between Mental, Social and Physical health as each one of these is equally important. More than 275 people joined the webinar and made it a success by giving 4+ ratings.



On 31st October 2020, Rashi Thakran : a mental health advocate, an activist, QPR instructor and WCCI member joined us in the webinar on Psychological First Aid (PFA). She addressed the audience on Post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), it's effects and causes. She also discussed how PFA is a crucial intervention to improve mental ill-health conditions. Around 300+ people joined us in this fruitful webinar and we got 4+ rating from 100% attendees.

LIVE SESSIONS (LGBTQIA+ Awareness)

On 12th September 2020, we were joined with Miss Aakriti Kainthola, an 18-year-old girl from Delhi and a social media influencer. More than 300 people joined us in this session.





On 24th September 2020, Damini Sinha addressed the live session. She is a representative of the queer community who identifies as a trans-woman. She is a software engineer, an LGBTQ+ blogger, and activist. More than 250 people joined us in this session.

On 8th of October, Gender Championship Cell had a very productive Instagram live session with Ekata, (she/her)a final year Master's student of Social Sciences at IIT Gandhinagar. She identifies as a bisexual women and an intersectional queer feminist. She heads the gender and sexuality cell at her college. The session was very informative on the topics such as bisexuality, intersectionality and feminism. More than 331 viewers joined us during the session.





On 24th October, Gender Championship Cell of SACE had a fruitful live session with Raj Saxena who is an Assistant Professor and an equal rights activist. Being an asexual himself and because of his personal experiences, he thought it was necessary to ensure representation of his community to help more individuals like him. So in 2013, he founded 'Indian Asexuals' which is India's First initiative for the asexual community working online and offline both. 434 people got connected with us for the live session.


On 1 Nov 2020, Gender Championship Cell SACE had a very productive live session with Raina Raonata, who is a biomedical engineer by profession has ventured into the creative field after graduation, she has also worked with byjus for creating educational videos. She is also working with SheThepeople's community from last 2 years, and now she is responsible for growing the SheThepeople's community/social platforms by starting up feminist conversations. 620 viewers joined us in the session.



On 7th November, Gender Championship Cell of SACE had an informative live session with Mx Dhananjay Chauhan, who is known as "The first transgender student" of Punjab University. She works for the importance of education and gender-identification and acceptance. Mx Dhananjay Chauhan, trans-woman and first Transgender student of Punjab University has not only challenged the norms of gender in a hyper-masculine setup. She has also reshaped the education system in the region of Punjab by opening the doors of Punjab University for Transgender people.

On 28th November, Gender Championship Cell had an enlightening live-session with Rahul Khemani, a consultant psychiatrist in practice for more than four years . He has completed his DNB in psychiatry from Tamil Nadu. He currently offers consultation at a clinic in Borivali, Mumbai. He has special interest in child mental health, de-addiction and psychotherapy. During the session, he talked about his personal experiences and explained why mental health is important for an individual and how to communicate with people having sensitive mental health. He explained what one should do when they are dealing with a mental-health challenge. He also discussed the process of invoking self-love and accepting ourselves as we are. An audience of 379 people made it a success.





10 January 2021 was witness to a live session with Sayed Raza Hussain Zaidi who is a founding member of Aazaadi International with over 6 years of experience in working with Youth in the area of social entrepreneurship and sustainable development goals. He has extensive experience of trainings in gender-sex-sexuality and working with Queer Community, students, educational institutions, and individuals belonging to socially-excluded and marginalized sections of society (Female Sex-Workers and Trans-genders). He is also a Member of Awadh Queer Pride Committee. We were joined by 302 viewers for the session. On 17 JANUARY, 2021, Gender Championship Cell: conducted an insightful live session with Lush monsoon aka Ayushmaan, who is a drag performer by night and a lawyer by day. They have been featured in leading publications which include BBC, Harper's Bazaar and Vogue. In the session, they discussed what it is to be a drag-performer in a country like India. They also spoke about the importance of expressing and accepting one-self as well as how we as society can move forward to address the idea of masculinity and femininity. 350+ viewers joined us for the session.






On 24th JANUARY 2021, Gender Championship Cell curated a very lively and interactive session with HITEN NOONWAL, an exclusive Design Educator and Fashion Designer. They are also a multi-disciplinary designer and a gender-fluid performance artist. They have also worked with Ritu Kumar, Raw Mango and other designer brands. Hiten shared their journey of success in a very interesting detailed manner. They shared how one can use art to express one's emotions and personality. Also how one should accept oneself. The video reached out to 244 people.

On 30TH JANUARY 2021, Gender Championship Cell, had an amazing live session with Shivli who is the founder of shivtensity. She's a counselling psychologist, sexuality educator and a PhD scholar. She introduced us with the idea of a safe inclusive space. She discussed how she worked with anganwadi workers and the state Commission for child rights. More than 200 people joined us for the live session.





On 4 FEBRUARY, 2021, Gender Championship Cell, had a thought provoking live with Anuja Razdan, who identifies as queer cis-woman. She is a student as well as mental and sexual health advocate based in New Delhi, pursuing her Masters in Psychology from SPPU. During the session, she talked about her experiences with the pandemic and its dual effect on us. An audience of 250 people was present.

Stories of LGBTQ+ community

- The first story is of Meghna Mehra, we got to know about her struggle with the society and discrimination for many years because she is an asexual woman.Her story emboldened us a lot. Inspite of the prejudice, she didn't give-up. Therefore, She founded AIQA (All India Queer Association) in 2019 and is continuously working for the community. The story reached out to an audience of 488 people.
- The second story throws light upon the prejudice against Deepak Chohtel by his own Pg-mates because of his effeminate gestures. Deepak is a homosexual, he is pursuing graduation from Delhi University. He accepted himself completely and he is open to many

of his friends, and believes that gradually everything will get better. The story reached out to an audience of 953 people.


After most, the inspiring story of another gay man named Sandeep, a resident of Haryana. Earlier, Sandeep was struggling with his identity, he convinced himself that may-be it's a phase and he thought that he shouldn't bother about this, but later after he realized that he is into men. He accepted himself and now he is in a relationship, living his life to the fullest. The stories reached as many as more than 1378 people.

KHANAK'21 (Celebrating Acceptance)

Khanak 2.0 celebrating acceptance was a two day event dated; 20th February and 21st February, which marked the presence of guests like Nitasa Biswas, Arouba Kabir, Riya Tickoo on the day 1 and Dr. Pragati Singh, Keval Harie, Raza Hussain Zaidi, Shaman Gupta, Gurleen Pannu, and Kashish Soni on day 2 respectively.

Promotions and efforts of Gender Championship Cell ensured 437 audience registrations for Khanak. With a maximum 200+ initial audience and more than hundred consistent audiences on both day 1 and day 2, no doubt audience engagement was bang on.





Khanak had some prestigious media partners like The Education Tree, DU Club, DU Media, DU Vibes, DU Express, Campus Bloggers and DU Thinks respectively.

The sponsors that made Khanak possible were Pari match which was given 350 sign-ups through our team, Digital Papa — which was given 200 followers and 50 shoutouts, Fun Fight — which was given 300 downloads by our team, which made Khanak a big success.

We got huge appreciation and positive feedback from attendees with 4+ ratings from 20% audience and 5 rationing from 80% of audience.
